Zhiyuan Cong earned a BFA in 1980 and an MFA in 1986 in Chinese painting from Nanjing Arts Institute. He then went on to earn an MFA in printmaking from Indiana University in 1994. Cong is currently professor and head of the Printmaking Program, director of the Center for Chinese Art at William Paterson University, and chair of the Chinese-American Art Faculty Association. His prior positions include consultant to both the Indianapolis Museum of Art and Qinghai Province Museum as well as professor of Nanjing Arts Institute. He has held more

than 30 solo exhibitions and over one hundred group exhibitions, including those at the National Museum of China in Beijing, the United Nations in New York and the Olympic Fine Arts Exhibition 2012 in London. Cong has also received numerous major media reports and reviews for his art works and achievements, including *The New York Times, The Star-Ledger, The Record, World Journal, Chinese News Net, People's Daily,* NJN, BBC, CNN and CCTV-4. Beyond his exhibitions, Cong has earned 2012



and 2016 Gold Awards in the Annual Educational Advertising Awards for his project *The First-Place Award*, The American States Arts Competition in 1993 and the Chinese Cultural Ambassador Award from the New Jersey Chinese-American Chamber of Commerce in 2012 for his service.

Liu Haisu (1896 – 1994) was a prominent twentieth-century Chinese artist and noted art educator. In 1912 he founded the first school of fine arts in modern China, the Shanghai School of Fine Arts. He initiated co-education, and pioneered human body model and traveling painting from nature. He was a brilliant artist who used his unique blend of European and Chinese techniques to revolutionize art education in China.

Yinchuan Conversation: Reflection and Outlook of the Art of Printmaking of China and the USA

The Chinese city of Yinchuan in the northwestern province of Ningxia may not be familiar to the Western art world, but it is the home of movable type printing - one of the four great inventions of Ancient China known throughout the world. In 1991, the original copy of the *Auspicious Tantra of All-Reaching Union* considered to be the earliest extant example of a book printed using wooden movable type during the Western Xia









Dynasty (1038–1227), was discovered in the ruins of the Baisigou Square Pagoda in Helan County, Ningxia Province, and is currently held at the Ningxia Institute of Archaeology in Yinchuan. In view of the historical significance of this city, it therefore becomes abundantly clear why we are calling our current exhibition *Yinchuan Conversation: Sino-US International Printmaking Art Exhibition*.

Yinchuan, the ancient capital of the Western Xia Dynasty and an oasis beyond the Great Wall of China, is a city of historical renown, situated at the main route of exchange between the cultures of the east and the west. The city witnessed the bitterest of clashes between the east and west civilizations and nations, and made great contributions towards cultural and economic exchanges between the east and the west. With her mighty and profound cultural traditions, Yinchaun embraces the cultural calling to nurture modern cultural development and communication. On behalf of printmaking artists from the United States, I would like to express our heartfelt gratitude towards our hosts for their generosity in creating this exhibition and thereby









making the cultural exchange between the printmaking artists of the two countries a reality.

The printmaking artists from the United States invited to participate in this exhibition are currently practicing mainstream artists from higher education institutions. They are leaders and organizers in the American Printmaking Association and major international print exhibitions, presidents of universities, chairs of printmaking departments, and professors. Some are veteran artists; some are young. They represent wide geographical locations, some from the east coast, some from the west coast, and some from the inland areas. Due to the limits of time and number of participants, we could only invite 20 artists from the United States, but without doubt the artists and their works of art are representative of American printmaking artists and art.

That their works of art are shown together with those of practicing Chinese printmaking artists will greatly promote exchange and understanding between printmakers of the east and west, enriching the language of printmaking, extending its vision, and breathing a new spirit into contemporary printmaking as an art form. It is an exhibition of great significance. I would like to express my sincere thanks to our host, to Mr. Jun Guang, dean of the Printmaking Academy of China National Academy of Painting, Mr. Daquan Dai, associate dean of the Printmaking Academy of China National Academy of Painting for organizing the program, and to Mr. Guirong Luo, vice president of Ningxia Artists Association for his curatorial work for the exhibition. It is a great pleasure for us at the Center for Chinese Art at William Paterson University to be given this great opportunity to participate in and sponsor the exhibition. I wish it great success.

Vision and Mission: the Chinese-American Art Faculty Association of the USA, August 6, 2016

I am very happy for the successful opening of the *Perception and Vision: Chinese-American Art Faculty Exhibition and Symposium* in the multicultural environment of the 9th China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Week, and in Guizhou, the province of diverse ethnicities. I want to express my sincere thanks to the China International Cultural Association, the Chinese-American Art Faculty Association, Guizhou Minzu University, and William Paterson University of New Jersey for co-hosting this art exhibition and the symposium.

Perception and Vision: Chinese-American Art Faculty Exhibition and *Symposium* is the fourth major event we've held in the past few years with a focus on Chinese-American Art Faculty and their art works. It is our hope that this exhibition and symposium serves not only as a forum for exchange with our Chinese colleagues in art and art education - especially those from Guizhou Province and ASEAN countries with whom we share our international perception and vision, thoughts, experiences and achievements in art research and creation - but also as an invaluable opportunity to promote understanding, development and communication between eastern and western art and culture.










Professor Zhiyuan Cong visited Guizhou Minzu University and Beijing Capital Normal University






EXHIBITIONS

Exhibitions are arranged and organized to provide more opportunities for students to learn about both Chinese art and culture. They showcase the high quality and unique production of internationally renowned artists, William Paterson faculty and student artists. The Center curates Chinese art exhibitions and displays them in the Ben Shahn Center for the Visual Arts and Power Art Center galleries of William Paterson University in New Jersey, as well as arranges for these exhibits to tour other universities in America and China. Subsequently, an exhibition catalogue with an introduction to the exhibition themes and interpretive essays on the history, culture, and arts of the period or region is published in both English and Chinese. Conferences, lectures, and ddemonstrations are presented and receptions are hosted during these exhibitions.





Chinese Ink Painting Courses





SUMMER ART IN CHINA STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

The Summer Art in China program, offered by the Center for Chinese Art and the Department of Art at William Paterson University, provides students with the opportunity to participate in a carefully organized study tour focused on viewing and investigating the complexities of China through the lens of visual art. This tour gives students the opportunity to study with actual Chinese artists and lecturers and to learn about new and old characteristics of Chinese culture in general and art in particular. Course credit is earned along with an invaluable cultural immersion experience. The Summer Art in China program has been in existence since Summer 2001. This study abroad program offers five weeks of intensive classes (two weeks prior to departure at the WPU campus) with faculty from both American and Chinese universities.

During the previous five trips, the tours explored cultural locations in Beijing, Shanxi, Shannxi, Henan, Anhui, Jiangsu, Shanghai, Guizhou and Sichuan, as well as cities and scenic locations including Natong, Nanjing, Hefei, Xian, Luoyang, Kaifeng, Suzhou, Yangzhou, Datong, Huangshan, Mount Wutai, Mount Heng, Taiyuan, Pingyao, Hukou Waterfall on the Yellow River and Mausoleum of the Yellow Emperor. The program established research and educational bases and an exchange mechanism with the National Art Museum of China in Beijing, Shannxi Province Art Museum, Anhui University in Hefei, Nanjing Arts Institute, Yangzhou University, Nantong Chinese Art Institute, Suzhou UniversityUniversity and Guizhou Minzu University.

The tours have included different lectures and demonstrations from artists in China and enabled students to view Asian culture with new perspectives. Students were able to absorb elements from different cultural traditions and



different periods of Chinese history. At the conclusion of the tours, the faculty and students produced a book for each trip, Summer Art in China 2001, 2005, 2008, 2011 and 2015, featuring essays and photographs focusing on the art, culture, education, history and content of China's cultural institutions, including museums. These publications have been very well received and won several important awards from higher education institutions.












PUBLICATIONS
